Which fees were covered?

For learners that undertook an eligible programme and were enrolled at a Te Pūkenga Division, Wānanga, Private Training Establishment or University

When did the course* start?

Before January 2020

Fees were only covered in exceptional circumstances and where a substantial proportion of their study occurred after 1 July 2020. A TEO could apply to the Tertiary Education Commission to consider payment of fees.

Between January and April 2020

Full course fees were covered where at least 75% of the course occurred after 1 July 2020. Half of course fees were covered if between 50% and 75% of the course occurred after 1 July 2020. Fees were not covered if less than 50% of the course occurred after 1 July 2020.

Between May and June 2020

Full course fees were covered if at least one third of the course occurred after 1 July 2020. Fees were not covered if less than one third of the course occurred after 1 July 2020.

After 1 July 2020

Full course fees were covered.

*For funding purposes, programmes of study (e.g. qualifications) are made up of courses. The start and end date of the individual course (not the start/end date of the qualification) determined whether fees were covered.

OR

For learners who undertook an eligible programme arranged by a Te Pūkenga Division**

Proportion of study and training that occurred from 1 July 2020 was covered.

If fees for study and training that occurred after 1 July 2020 were paid prior to 1 July **2019**, these fees might not have been refunded. Te Pūkenga Divisions had to notify the TEC where fees could not be refunded.

**During 2021 and 2022 Industry Training Organisations transitioned their arranging of training to Te Pūkenga or PTEs. These start date rules applied to eligible programmes previously arranged by Industry Training Organisations.
